# **MIC3/Interstate Compact Law**

MIC3/Interstate Compact is a law specifically addressing the needs of *transitioning military students.* In response to NC's adoption of the Compact (<u>GS</u> <u>115C-407.5</u>).

All 50 states have signed onto The Compact, which focuses on these issues for military children:

- enrollment
- eligibility
- placement
- graduation

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (from the Compact website www.mic3.net) What Are The Issues? Military families encounter school challenges for their children for enrollment, eligibility, placement and graduation due to frequent relocations in service to our country.

What Is The Compact? The Compact provides for the uniform treatment of military children transferring between school districts and states. It was developed by The Council of State Governments' National Center for Interstate Compacts, the Department of Defense, national associations, federal and state officials, departments of education, school administrators and military families.

How Does a State Join the Compact? Each state must adopt the Compact through their legislative process. Participation is voluntary.

What Children Are Eligible For Assistance Under The Compact?

Children Of:

- Active duty members of the uniformed services, National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders
- Members or veterans who are medically discharged or retired for (1) year
- Members who died on active duty
