# Exam Attendance Policy

By board policy, the following criteria must be met to be exempt from a non-EOC, non-CTE Post Assessments course.

- Final average of 95-100 with four or fewer absences
- Final average of 90-94 with two or fewer absences
- See individual teacher for clarification

Excused absences count in the total number of absences!

NO exemptions allowed in EOC courses and CTE Courses.

Teachers will notify students of exam exemption eligibility

STUDENTS MUST REPORT TO CAMPUS FOR EOC, CTE EXAMS and TEACHER MADE EXAMS.
