English II Course Description:

The focus of the 10th grade English curriculum is to familiarize students with a wide variety of genres and texts from around the world. In this class, we will be reading and working with all types of texts, such as: novels, nonfiction, plays, short stories, poems, informational texts, videos, and art. All students will be encouraged to become more experienced English scholars, while also becoming better critical thinkers and analyzers. We will work with reading, writing, vocabulary, and grammar in order to become well-rounded learners. Students are required to take the EOC.

Textbook Policy:

Students will be assigned a consumable Springboard textbook for the semester. Much of the work that we complete in class will be pulled from this text book. Students may also be asked to access the textbook online via Springboard digital in class and at home.

Late Work Policy:

As a general rule, late work will NOT be accepted, especially daily work. Problems with computers, printers, coffee, dogs, etc. are NOT excuses; students should complete assignments early if they are afraid they will encounter problems. Family and medical emergencies are exceptional circumstances. Contact me immediately if something arises. Documentation of these circumstances must be provided, and an alternate due date will be decided upon.

Make-Up Work Policy:

You will have five days after an absence to make up missed work. It is your responsibility on the day you return from an absence to get your make-up work. If you are absent on the day an assignment is due, it is due the day you return to school—no excuses. Extra time may be granted under certain circumstances; see me AHEAD of time if you need more time, and we will discuss that possibility.

Assignments

All assignments should be completed to the best of your ability. Homework is to be completed prior to class. If you are working on this assignment after the bell rings, your work is considered incomplete, and you will earn the grade appropriate for what you have finished. If you ever have questions or need clarification on an assignment, ask! Some assignments will require the internet; you have several options for internet access if you do not have this at home. Those options include: my classroom after class work is completed, before and after school in my room or the media center, or the public library.

Note: In WHS's English Department, we focus on thematic units and do not test as frequently as other subjects. Please be aware that tests and projects should be taken seriously for you to succeed in this class. Extra credit is not guaranteed and is under the discretion of the teacher.

Plagiarism Policy:

"Plagiarism" refers to any work being represented as a student's own that has been paraphrased or copied without proper credit from another source. Sources include but are not limited to books, online material, another student's work, and a former student's work.
